And, there are so many more ways folks are stepping up, and offering themselves. All are needed, and all are appreciated.

Time and again I've heard how those who can no longer offer some physical labor can always pray. I agree with this, whole-heartedly! And there is another way I'd like to see our leaders re-activate. I would like to have those who have had a lifetime of service, serve as a mentor and a coach to those who are new and perhaps unsure of what they've been asked to take on.

We need all of the gifts of all of the people in our church. Because reaching more people for Christ means we have to build up our leaders.





#### A Mother's Love

This Sunday we celebrated Mother's Day. A day began by the Methodist Church to honor those who gave us birth and those who raised us. I wanted so badly to be a good mother, I hope I succeeded more than I failed. I was a fortunate Mother, I had good children. They still are in my heart daily as they have raised children of their own, now adults. I know the worries they face because I have faced them myself. They are always in your thoughts and prayers.

The sermon this week was about Generosity and as Rev. Gotham said who better to represent generosity than a Mother. It begins with the pregnancy, then sleep deprivation; who needs sleep when an infant's needs are more important. Giving up sleep without resentment or regret is just the beginning of generosity with a Mother and it doesn't end with infancy but continues on until they leave home. Generosity for a Mother includes not only making sure they are well clothed and have all the necessities of life but also includes eating the broken egg, the cold meal, grocery shopping when you really don't feel like it, working a job that you may not enjoy but the hours are better for your children, calling in sick when they have a snow day and making cookies.

Generosity doesn't come from a bank account but is a sacrifice of self. It's doing what needs to be done because it is what you want to do for them and it's love. We see generous people in our church lives daily. They are the ones who help us out of the car, greet us at the door, prepare funeral luncheons, usher us to our seats, prepare our coffee and tea and cookies for fellowship, serve on our committees, make sure our mission goals are met, serve at Warming Center and MCREST, clean up our section of Van Dyke in Utica, keep our grounds looking nice, prepare our pews, knit and pray over prayer shawls, and sew dresses for Haiti.

Remember the TV show that said "There are a million stories in the Naked City" that is how church is, there are a myriad of jobs. These jobs are done by people with a generous spirit. People who care about their church. I have said nothing about the generous gifts of money that keep the church functioning, that keep the lights on, that pay the salaries, that enable us to grow together and reach out to others.

Then there is the extra giving that pays for things like the parking lot lighting, and a electronic sign, and the new van. We are a generous people. But we give because we have been given. God so loved us that he gave his only begotten son. Christ gave up his life on the cross for the forgiveness of our sins. How can we not be a generous people as a Mother is generous and giving to her children, as a Father is generous and giving to his family, as God has been and will continue to be generous to those who follow him and love his Son? God takes our generosity and uses it. Let us be in every way God's generous people.

Luke 21:1-4 As he looked up, Jesus saw the rich putting their gifts into the temple treasury. He also saw a poor widow put in two very small copper coins. "I tell you the truth," he said, "this poor widow has put in more than all the others. All these people gave their gifts out of their wealth; but she out of her poverty put in all she had to live on.

2 Corinthians 8: 7 But just as you excel in everything --in faith, in speech, in knowledge, in complete earnest-ness and in your love for us--see that you excel in the grace of giving.

Thank you God for Mother's, those that gave us birth, those who were examples in generosity to us, those that raised us, those who mentored us, and those who were kind to us and taught us kindness.

May we be reflections of their generosity. Amen
