At the end of his life, John Wesley, the founder of the movement called Methodism, was speaking to those gathered near. Wesley's strength and ability to speak were ebbing. He greeted loved ones who gathered, sang bits of a hymn, and expressed his wishes for his funeral. While all of what he spoke that day was inspiring, the phrase that speaks loudest, in my opinion, was his saying, "And Best of all, God is with us!"

Wesley was known for his Easter greeting of, "He Is Risen!" He greeted friends, colleagues, and congregations with those words. And, as you know well, those he greeted would reply, "He Is Risen, Indeed!" Wesley wanted everyone to know the importance of serving a resurrected Christ. He wanted everyone to know this truth because of what it means for each of us every day of our lives.

When we have and keep a resurrection mindset, something happens to us. When we know that our savior lives and that we will live forever with Him, we can face today's struggles. When we know and own within our hearts the promise of spending eternity with God because of what Jesus did for us on Good Friday and Easter Sunday, we find courage that would otherwise be denied to us.

Easter provides us with the blessing that we don't have to go through life uncertain about what will happen at the end of our days. That blessing is meant to change things for us right now, not just when we pass from this life to the next. Easter blesses us with hope, cheer, purpose, and joy because, best of all, God is with us!

This article will provide an update concerning our Utica UMC mission trip to God's Country Community Ministries in the UP. Our application has been accepted and we have been assigned the period from June 16th to June 22nd. We will depart from Sterling Heights after church services on Sunday, June 16th. We will work on a ministry project starting Monday and continuing through Friday morning. On Friday afternoon, we will visit some of the local attractions possibly including the Tahquamenon Falls or Kitch-Iti-Kipi Springs. Then on Saturday, we will return home to prepare for the coming week. We currently have 14 team members who plan to participate in the mission trip. We will be holding our first Mission Team Planning Meeting on Tuesday, April 2nd at 7 PM to share more information about the trip and to begin planning details in preparation for our trip. All those who may have interest in participating as a part of the team or to support the team with whatever needs are identified, are welcome to attend.

This mission trip to God's Country is being performed on behalf of the Utica United Methodist Church. The outreach is a church-wide effort to share our love with those in need who live in a harsh winter climate for much of the year. Those who are not available to participate in this mission trip are welcome to come to this meeting to learn how you might become a part of the mission. We will need your help to purchase materials to support our project work while at the mission site. We will also be looking to bring items requested on the ministry's "Community Needs List" to address the clients who rely on Director - Randy Hildebrandt and his GCCM team to share God's love in the UP.

Together In Missions

Each month, T.I.M. will highlight a ministry that Utica UMC is supporting. For the month of April, we will again be highlighting the Methodist Children's Home in Redford. In the past, our support has included Easter Baskets, hygiene products and sporting goods products also Christmas gifts and stocking stuffers.

The following is the opening of their history:

MCHS Family of Services, originally named Methodist Child Care and then Methodist Children's Home Society, was founded in 1917, a year in which Detroit factories were busy turning out war material for the conflict in Europe. When a disastrous epidemic of influenza hit the city, children whose parents died were often left without friends or relatives to care for them. Such was the plight of numerous children discovered by members of the order of deaconesses of the Methodist Church, when making their rounds in the residential sections of Detroit industrial areas.

To hear more about this ministry, join us for a tour of the facility on May 7th. We will be leaving our parking lot at 10 AM and should return around 1pm.

Please sign up on the sheets in the parlor or in the Fellowship Hall so we can be sure we have adequate transportation arranged.

Another way to help continue our longtime support of the 70 children and youth of this ministry is by donating personal hygiene supplies for boys. Items to consider include brush, comb, hair picks, soap, deodorant, razors, shaving cream. Please drop the items in the boxes provided in the narthex or near the back entrance. Items will be delivered during our tour on May 7th.
