Soon you see people who are gone. A woman who was living in her car and was killed in the tornado, others that had killed as part of the "Klan." Communion comes to Sally Fields character, and she passes it to her husband whose presence is still beside her, he passes it to the young boy beside him who is the one who killed him and says, "Peace of God." Forgiveness abounds in this small church. It reminds me that people are not always judged by what is in their heart but by the cruel hate that is in other hearts. That forgiveness can come to all that seek it and that we are blessed when we give it to others.
