Cass Community Services "Hands With Detroit" Utica UMC Participation

So what does God's work look like? Is it feeding the homeless or building a ramp for the disabled? Many opportunities to do God's work were offered last Saturday at Cass Community Services. Although a small representation of the Utica church, several of us traveled to Detroit to spend the afternoon SHREDDING!! Yes... shredding!

Here is a brief excerpt from the Cass Community Services' website:

Document Destruction Program

Paper document security is just as important as electronic security. Research shows that most identity thieves obtain information through traditional paper-based sources rather than electronic channels.

Every day at Cass Community Social Services, Green Industries' employees are responsible for destroying sensitive documents for security-conscious customers. Since 2007, the workers have serviced documents for doctors, lawyers, accountants and other professionals, all while providing vital jobs for workers with disabilities.

While there were a variety of work projects to assist the Cass Community Services ministries, our group elected to assist with the paper shredding program offered by Cass. If you have ever wanted to take your old school books and "tear them to pieces", then you missed a great opportunity to fulfill your dreams while also serving God!! In all seriousness, this step in the shredding business is critical to enabling unwanted, hard cover books to be recycled. The following photos provide a brief description of the process:

Step 1 – Tear the covers off the book and rip pages into groups of 5 or less.

Step 2 – Separate colored and glossy paper from white paper.

Step 3 – Load paper onto conveyor to the shredder and baler machine.



Step 4 – The finished product is shredded paper bales.



Together In Missions

Each month, T.I.M. will highlight a ministry that Utica UMC is supporting. For the month of April, we will again be highlighting the Methodist Children's Home in Redford. In the past, our support has included Easter Baskets, hygiene products and sporting goods products also Christmas gifts and stocking stuffers.

The following is the opening of their history:

MCHS Family of Services, originally named Methodist Child Care and then Methodist Children's Home Society, was founded in 1917, a year in which Detroit factories were busy turning out war material for the conflict in Europe. When a disastrous epidemic of influenza hit the city, children whose parents died were often left without friends or relatives to care for them. Such was the plight of numerous children discovered by members of the order of deaconesses of the Methodist Church, when making their rounds in the residential sections of Detroit industrial areas.

To hear more about this ministry, join us for a tour of the facility on May 7th. We will be leaving our parking lot at 10 AM and should return around 1pm.

Please sign up on the sheets in the parlor or in the Fellowship Hall so we can be sure we have adequate transportation arranged.

Another way to help continue our longtime support of the 70 children and youth of this ministry is by donating personal hygiene supplies for boys. Items to consider include brush, comb, hair picks, soap, deodorant, razors, shaving cream. Please drop the items in the boxes provided in the narthex or near the back entrance. Items will be delivered during our tour on May 7th. This is the last chance to bring in items for MCHS.

Used Book Sale

I don't know how people who are alone function without the contact of friends, family, or neighbors. I have some friends that I have known for most of my life, 70 some years. Many are gone. Some friends that I have known for less time but are in my life now. I spoke with a friend not long ago that I have known for over 70 years. It always amazes me that it is like picking up a conversation that we are continuing from yesterday. We met in Nurses Training. We were both unable to swim and were very thin. She learned to swim I didn't. We both ate little but shared eggs. She liked only the white portion, and I liked the yoke. She would eat two whites and I would eat 2 yokes. We both went through heart aches and trials. Our friendship has lasted with her living up north and me living here. We have only seen each other a few times in these last years, less than years ago. We were better at physically connecting a long time ago, but families, jobs, and distance have kept us apart. Now we use the phone. I also have friends from right now. Some are younger (although not by much, the things we have known are still relatable and we share memories of how it used to be) and have been so good to me. Even my hairdresser this week reminded me that she has been doing my hair for over 24 years. My friends and I go out to lunch, they insist on driving me to doctor appointments and even though I tell them, I can do it myself, they come with me, and I am so grateful. There are those who remember me when there are evening services at church, and they know I no longer like to drive after dark and they offer me a ride. I went out to lunch three times this week and enjoyed it so much. I have been able to get out more and that is a blessing and to get out with friends is a double blessing. As I was thinking of my good fortune with friends I thought about Jesus. He, of course, had the 12. They traveled together, ate together, slept together, and he taught them and prepared them for their mission. Jesus also had friends that he could visit with, even though he was still the teacher. He had Lazarus and Mary and Martha. He stayed with them and talked with them. Mary had washed Jesus' feet with her tears and dried them with her hair. When Lazarus had died Jesus came and raised him from the dead.

John 11:5 Jesus loved Martha and her sister and Lazarus.

John 11:35 Jesus wept.

Lord, we thank you for the gift of friends and for the memories we share with those we've known for so long. We thank you for new friends and for the joy they bring into our lives. We thank you for our church, for our Pastor and ask your blessings on him and his family, and for those who work so diligently to do those things that further your kingdom and our service to our community. We thank you for those who use our Pantry and for those who leave things for others. We thank you for those who seek comfort in the veteran's memorial, and we thank you for their service.
