FOR GOD'S GLORY

We are grateful for your faithful giving and extra year-end giving for the Operating Fund. The green letters in the title of this article reflect the progress we made in the month of November toward meeting our remaining obligations for the year. Our advancement is directly dependent on the contributions we receive each week.

As of December 1, we still have about \$56,000 in remaining obligations. This includes: \$16,000 for compensation; \$24,200 for utilities, insurance, & upkeep; \$8,000 for ministries & administration; and \$7,775 for conference pensions & ministry shares.

Our financial gifts for the Operating Fund are made for God's glory. By ensuring we meet our annual financial obligations, we glorify God by enabling Utica UMC to serve where God calls us to serve.

We are able to receive contributions in the form of cash, checks, stocks/bonds/mutual funds, etc. We also have e-Giving available for your convenience. If you would like to make a year-end gift of stocks/bonds/mutual funds or a qualified charitable distribution from your IRA for 2024, please consider doing this soon so it will be processed before the end of the year.

Gifts need to be received by noon on December 31 to be included in your 2024 giving statement. However, to enable us to meet our obligations to others before the end of the year, we will appreciate your gifts by December 22, if possible. Gifts received the week of December 29 will also enable us to meet expenses (e.g., payroll) we have in the first few weeks of the new year.
