Once again, the time of the church calendar has arrived when we must pause, take a deep breath, and embark upon the journey of Advent. The term Advent comes from the Latin word "Adventus," meaning "coming," or "arrival." It announces the arrival of someone, and in our case, Advent announces the coming of the Savior of the world, Jesus Christ.

For us, Advent is a time of waiting in anticipation of the Savior's arrival. But like anyone who has waited for the arrival of an important guest, we prepare ourselves. Therefore, Advent invites us to prepare for Christ's arrival.

FIFTEEN STARS GUIDING THE WAY TO MEET OUR 2025 OBLIGATIONS



In November we received \$25,330 for the Operating Fund. We paid \$22,700 in Operating Fund expenses. The list below shows our progress in the 15 areas guiding our way to meeting our remaining 2025 Operating Fund expenses. A circle indicates the expense still needs to be paid. A solid star indicates the item is paid in full. We project we will need an additional \$30,000 - \$40,000 to meet our remaining expenses for 2025.

While the Operating Fund may not tug at our heart-strings like some of our other ministries, it forms the foundation of everything we do. Our pastor, staff, and ministries depend on this foundation remaining strong. Each contribution, whether it is \$1, \$10, or \$100 is appreciated and enables us to move closer to fulfilling our needs.
