Chris Tomlin wrote a song called "Forever." Some of the lyrics are as follows:

Give thanks to the Lord, Our God and King
His love endures forever
For He is good, He is above all things
His love endures forever
Sing praise, sing praise

Forever God is faithful
Forever God is strong
Forever God is with us
Forever

Our Lenten journey is coming to an end. As I have shared over the last few weeks, we are not alone and God is with us. As we begin Holy Week, Chris Tomlin's song is a reminder of just how faithful and strong God is, and that His love endures forever. The week begins with Palm Sunday and Jesus' triumphant entry into Jerusalem. We will wave our palms and sing our praises on this day. Later in the week, we are reminded of The Last Supper Jesus ate with His disciples and our Lord's faithfulness as he prayed for God's will to be done before being betrayed by one that he loved. We then turn to Good Friday and Jesus' enduring love that wouldn't allow him to walk away from God's mission to redeem us, even as the crown of thorns was placed on his head, and he carried his cross to his death. And while we reflect and mourn his suffering and death, we also can anticipate that Easter Sunday is coming!

My hope is that you will be able to attend service with us on Palm Sunday. Come and rejoice, sing praise and wave the palms.

Join us on April 2nd at 7pm for our Maundy Thursday service. This will be a unique service that you will not want to miss.

Good Friday will happen on April 3rd at 7pm and will be a time of prayer and reflection of the cross. Reflect on what Jesus' sacrifice has had on your life.

Your marching orders are to come, to reflect, to participate and to invite someone else to share this journey with you.

Father God, as we prepare ourselves for Holy Week, let your Holy Spirit come among us and breathe life into us. Let your presence be known to us this coming week. May you speak to us in your own way. Comfort those who are sick, those who are in mourning and those who are facing any number of struggles. Thank you for your enduring love for us forever. Amen.

A Good Man Is Hard to Find

And other short stories.

By Flannery O'Connor

Does your life always seem rushed? Join the crowd. From today's traffic, to grocery shopping and shopping online for stuff, I am left with little time for enjoying a good book. But I found a great book that helped me solve that time issue. This book comes with the endorsement of Joan Sanders as a book to not pass up.

Let me give this to you from the book's jacket. In 1955, with this short story collection, Flannery O'Connor firmly claimed her place as one of the most original and provocative writers of her generation. Steeped in Southern Gothic tradition that would become synonymous with her name, these stories show O'Connor's unique, grotesque view of life --infused with religious symbolism haunted by apocalyptic possibility, sustained by the tragic comedy of human behavior confronted by the necessity of salvation.

Through these classic stories, including "The Life You Save May Be Your Own", "Good Country People", "The Displaced Person", and seven other acclaimed tales, O'Connor earned a permanent place in the hearts of American readers.
